ife really does encompass a million emotions. doesn't it? Emotions of joy, anxiety, fear, anger, pain, sadness and a whole bunch of others. Some that can't be explained even if written as books. and some that are just understood in a smile that hides the pain. Whichever is the case, we humans have been bound to feel, live through and make decisions based on these emotions: which we sometimes feel grateful for and at other times regret doing so. A lot of us would have either received or given the advice of asking not to react on the basis of emotions, to try to control them and think practically when put in a spot. But how often do we wonder that when some emotions felt and reacted to, can change the world? The emotion of love gave the world a man named Jesus. As much as these are just an extremely minute detail of examples in the realm of life, one probably would agree that it sums up how. one wrong move could've changed the game entirely in each of these cases. I often wonder why Jesus could've - but did not - step off the cross and condemn his crucifiers to eternal hellfire. About how Medusa could've easily argued with Athena about her not protecting her devotee from the hands of Poseidon in spite of knowing it was his fault - but she chose not to do it. About how, if Sita asked the same question to Rama, things might have become extremely complicated for her and

for Ramayanam. And why Hitler a man that everyone feared had to silently and secretively prepare for his own death instead of fighting it out. Questioning the whys and

whats and hows of a person's reaction to what they have done has been common culture since forever. But do we understand the meaning behind these reactions, in its truest form? Or do we shun it away... saying we know enough and need not see the good behind the emotions?

More often than not, we never know what a person genuinely is going through. But then again, we tend to be very quick to judge them as well. The good in a person can easily be misidentified as selfish, too hard - pressing and such, while the evil can be highly respected and revered. CORRUGATED BOXES AND ITS TYPES

orrugated boxes are regularly used as transportation containers. Any item at your favourite supermarket, premium store, or shopping mall were carefully delivered in boxes made of corrugated cardboard, which were manufactured and used for transportation purpose. Boxes provide an amazing measure of product protection by themselves but usually need internal segments such as cushioning, bracing and blocking to improve the protection of fragile products. The shipping hazards depend largely upon the particular logistics system being employed. Ordinary transportation containers require to print and label to identify the products, printed legal and regulatory information, and bar codes. Some boxes are designed for the display of products on the shelf.

Corrugated is a strong, light-weight and durable material made up of three layers of brown craft paper. It includes a process for pulping wood pieces into a strong board that resists tearing, splitting, and breaking. From a paper mill, rolls of craft paper are transported to a corrugating plant. In the manufacturing process, layers of craft paper are folded and glued to make corrugated cardboard, which is then built into corrugated boxes. Fastgrowing pine trees are the primary raw material to make corrugated cardboard. Glue made of corn starch is used to bond the corrugated medium, as more glue is used it is delivered as a dry powder to store until the usage. Paraffin waxes or vegetable oils are used to make a water or grease-resistant container for food products.

TYPES OF CORRUGATED BOXES

REGULAR CONTAINERS This is the common type of box style efficiently designed for packaging. All covers are the same length from the score to the edge. These are used for a variety of products shipping, small and individual items such as cups, glasses and books can be easily packed. A very little manufacturing waste is produced in the making of these boxes. These boxes can be folded and stored also, can be shipped as flat cardboard.

CORRUGATED
TRAYS | Perfect for shipping small, lightweight loads. They are beneficial, with product visibility and easy handling are of prime importance. Used in food and beverage industry products such as bottled water, soft drinks, snacks, and bulk packaged foods. It also provide extra stability and safety while moving plants or other agile objects.

TELESCOPE TYPE BOX | The telescoping

corrugated box design is constructed with an adjustable 2-piece F.O.L (full overlap) set designed to fit tall and odd-shaped products. The set is combined with one inner and one outer box used together to create a telescoping corrugated box.

HALF SLOTTED CONTAINERS | Half slotted

containers are containers that have only one set of flaps. The opposite side of the box is open, which allows it to slide over an item. Bottom flaps are with uniform length and meet the centre of the box while absent top flaps leave the top of the box uncovered. They are highly efficient, durable, and versatile offering many different applications for storing and transporting. Mostly used for shipping of large and heavy products such as refrigerators and washing machines.

SLIDE TYPE CORRUGATED BOX

Sliding corrugated boxes are gift boxes, sleeves, slipcases, which is one of the most featured box products. Also known as drawer paper box, slipcase and matchbox style. It is widely used for packaging of up-scale books, software, jewellery, electronic products and cosmetic

CUSTOM DIE CUT | Custom corrugated boxes developed to exact specifications depending on customer requirements. It can be manufactured with a variety of box styles, full colour and available in all custom sizes. Used for unique products with specific requirements such as luxurious product boxes, doll product boxes, and premium product boxes.


FULL OVERLAP CORRUGATED BOX The outer flaps overlap the full width of the box making it exceptionally resistant to rough

handling. Overlapping provides added cushioning and protection. All flaps are the same depth, and their depth equals the width of the box. These are used for heavy objects which require extra support.

ROLL END TUCK TOP | Roll end tuck top boxes are unplugged from the top like a treasure chest. These need to be folded when assembled. Such style provides an extremely strong structure which is why it can manage heavy duty item. Mostly used for cosmetics, food and retail product packaging, vitamin packaging, coffee packaging and tea packaging.

FOLDER TYPE CORRUGATED BOX | This type of boxes has a flat bottom that is rigid. The side surfaces are joined to the ends of the corrugated cardboard at the bottom. The design of the boxes can be enhanced by adding holders, locks and display panels according to the requirements. They are normally designed to pack large or irregularly shaped products.

But, the virtual takeover had many individuals feeling lost and anxious. And as a student, I found myself glued to my gadgets, many times for academic purposes. Countless deadlines and switching between Zoom links were my new normal. There were out-and-out issues

with my emotional and mental health. I was not prepared to face a prolonging pandemic, let alone the aftermath

In between all of this, I 'tried' to make time and appreciate my mother's cooking or to watch a movie with my father. More than a natural feeling, maintaining the bonds were turning into a responsibility that I needed to behold. Now, did the pandemic have

Malhotra clears the air
with her observation that
states, "Some relationships
were also slowly depleting and
withering away because, again,
we had so much time to ourselves,
that we got to know a little more about
ourselves, what we want, what is working for us
and what isn't working for us."

She also reveals that she saw a lot of relational changes in between couples and families. "It has a lot to do with people being unable to regulate their emotions during this stressful and uncertain time and hence it translates into their work, personal, romantic or platonic relationships," she added.

To develop good and healthy relationships

with people surrounding you, focus on communicating better, advises Malhotra. She gives us seven points that can be practiced to mend and maintain your relations among kin:

- By showing affection and appreciation to each other.
- By spending some quality time together.
- To try to eat at least one meal together.
- By ending support to each other.
- Try to cultivate regard and respect for each other.
- Pave way to create trust between each other.
- By creating rules and regulations within the family.

While we are talking about relationships, let us not forget about relationships with yourself. For a person like me, it has rather become more difficult to connect with people in an emotional way due to the year-long gap. And most importantly, I have forgotten the way to separate my personal and work time. This has not just caused disruptions within my relationships, but left negative impacts on my health.

If you can relate to me, and if you wish to pull yourself out of this, Malhotra suggests creating a routine. She says, "To keep the worklife balance in this digital day and age,

alance in this digital day and age, create a timetable and spend time on doing any of your favourite

hobbies. Turn off your internet for a short period of time and focus on improving your lifestyle. Practice meditation for erratic thoughts, stress and to deal with overwhelming emotions." She also asks us to make yourself a priority. "Remember, everything in your life will work smoothly only when you are feeling good."

Relationships can take a drastic 180* turn with the influences from many external factors.

Unlike the past years, we have now gotten a chance to come closer and rework on our lost connections. Ben Hecht once said, love is the magician that pulls a man out of his own hat. If you can find your lost love for your family and friends in these unprecedented times, you will eventually find healthy relationships with your inner self as well.





FOLLOW BEFORE AND AFTER **GETTING VACCINATED**



Talk to your GP. Understand how the vaccine works.

In case you have allergies to any medication, or drugs, it is important to get an all-clear from your family doctor or medical practitioner.

Your doctor may order some routine examinations. A complete blood count (CBC), C-reactive protein (CRP), or Immunoglobulin-E (IgE) are likely to be advised before the doctors says you can go ahead with the vaccination.

Eat a light meal before leaving home. You may not be able to have anything immediately after, at least for a few minutes.

Relax. Its like any other vaccination drive. Stay positive and cautious. If you are feeling anxious, a health counsellor can help you cope.

Wear light, comfortable clothes. In all probability, you will be sitting while being given the shot in your arm.

Go to the vaccination centre with a proper mask covering your mouth and nose, and stay at least six feet away from others until it is your turn to take the shot.



Do not hide any ailments/conditions or allergies from your certifying doctor who gives you the go-ahead for the vaccination.

Do not consume alcohol or any substance before being vaccinated, nor during and after.

While at the vaccination centre, don't touch items or other patients around the place. Basically, maintain regular COVID-19-appropriate

Do not self-medicate: Do not listen to any 'friendly' advice to take any Over-The-Counter drugs like acetaminophen or ibuprofen - painkillers etc - in anticipation of potentially having side effects from the vaccine. Your doctor knows best. Consult the expert.

WATCH OUT

These are the commonly reported side effects after vaccination:

Pain at the injection site

Swelling in the arm where you got your shot

Fever | Chills

Tiredness

Headache

even trials for a same case on the complaint of Annas and Caiphas against the son of God. The Sanhedrin, the Jewish court has tried Jesus for Blasphemy and it convicted him by merely recording the statement of Jesus. Jesus answered, "If I tell you, you will not believe me, and if I asked you, you would not answer. But from now on, the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the mighty God."

The most intelligent human ever seen in the universe, the prophet Daniel in 550 B.c recorded this son of man in his book as "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man" - Daniel 7:9. Jewish court has sentenced capital punishment for the above statement of Jesus for Blasphemy for claiming son of man. As the Jewish court has asked Jesus to refuse him as a son of man. Now the trouble starts whether Jewish court can convict a person by imposing a capital punishment, when the entire nation was ruled by the Roman Empire. The religious case was turned into a treason case but no judgement was arrived by the Roman Judge. But on compulsion without any judicial conclusion on behalf of the Jewish religious pressure Jesus was killed, when Jesus was acquitted by the Pilate and found no wrong in him. It is the first time in the history of the world an acquitted person was punished with a capital punishment.

Today so many persons in different countries bearing different religious and ethnical identity were killed, assassinated and massacred by King Dairus.

Jewish community is strong for their faith in Torah and even they are dare to violate the land laws when it crosses their own religious laws. Daniel has violated when King Dairus asked to worship him for 30 days, Daniel denied it and worshiped Jehovah instead of King Dairus. The Kings Men filed a case against Daniel and the Kings Court has passed an order for a capital punishment by an execution of putting Daniel in the Lion's den for a day.

In Sadam Husaain's Iraq, the Christian community was charged punitive tax, compelled to convert to Islam and even state killed them for the non-obedience of the state order. More than 1,00,000/- Christians in Iraq faced Lion's den in Sadam's reign.

The Present North Korean Communist Kingdom want to worship their leader failed to do so, Christians are imprisoned, and many have reportedly been tortured and executed. Believers meet secretly, and risk arrest and death by doing so.



In Somalia Christians cannot own a Bible, they are killed on the spot without any reasons or trial. Christians at Somalia abandon all their gatherings in the name of god and even denied to declare themselves as Christians.

In Sudan Converting a person from Islam to Christianity is Blasphemy and they put them to an immediate death. In Pakistan Christians are treated as second class citizens, women's are subjected to frequent sexual abuse. Churches are banned in Maldives, conversion from Islam leads to forfeiting Maldivian citizenship. In Saudi Arabia conversion from Islam is punishable by death. Kidnaping and killing Yemeni Christians is frequent and a routine work of Al-Quaida.

Phones and Houses are bugged in Uzbekistan. Without state licence no one can run any religious institution. Registered churches are subject to state monitoring. Unregistered churches are often raided and intruded with hard punishment for their faith, imprisonment, beatings and sometimes banishment. Destroying Church buildings and attack on Christians are common in Vietnam.

Rape, Torture and killings are throughout the Central African Republic. The Anti-Balaka groups even destroy the entire village in a barbaric manner. In Turkmenistan churches are filtered by informers, Members are threatened, fined and imprisoned.

In India several sates pass anti-conversion laws. Religious conversion is banned by direct and indirect methods even its constitution protects right for conversion and practise any religion. The fundamentalist groups dominated in saffron coloured parts of the nation destroy church buildings, homes of Christians and even manhandling is common. Murder in public is visualised in many parts of India. The incidents of 1998 South eastern Gujarat attack, 1999 Ranalai Violence, 2007 Christmas violence in Kandhamal, 2008 Kandhamal Violence, 2008 South Karnataka attack are the major violence against Christians in India.

The Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Forcible Conversion of Religion Bill 2002 are recalled when it faces public heat, the then government withdrawn the above act.

Freedom of Religion Act was passed in 2003 and 2006 respectively in Gujarat and Himachal. The same as the condition in Uttar Pradesh. The laws are misused against the propagation of religion which is the basic structure and the foundation of the Indian constitution.

In Ethiopia Christian face harassments, in Egypt they are vandalised by the fundamentalist groups. In Burma Buddhist Army even kills Muslims and Christians who are against their faith. Burmese government has limited conversion and restricted inter-faith marriages. In Syria after the outbreak of civil war in 2011, more than 7,00,000/-Christians were fled out of the country.

The Russian government wants the Christians to come out of their faith. The religious cult Jehovah witness failed to do so and practised their faith against the Russian legislation, now thousands of witnesses were sentenced for a term of 6 years and fined. The New Word Translation bible and the JW organisation were banned in Russia. For the reasons for the ban is that the JW organisation claim the northern empire mentioned in the bible is the present Russian government. They claim that the Russian government will join hands with the

American government in the last world order. It is notable in this point where the united states supreme court has given

exemption to the Jehovah witness sect from honouring the national anthem and US flag hoisting.

Not only in the religious sphere but also in the political sphere where the persons revolt against the inhumane laws of the land. It held in the holocaust of Germany. In 1995 massacre of muslim Bosniak men and boys in Srebrenica in Bosnia and Herzegovina. As it is done in

the democratic Kampuchea totally 33 percent of the Cambodians were killed.97% of circassian

was cleared by Russian army in 1864. The ottoman empire in turkey has evacuated 50% of Armenian's in their Kingdom land. The Rwandan, Greek, Dzungar, Bangaladesh, Assyrian, Polish, Aardakh, East Timor, Tamil and Rohingya genocide are the best examples of the Lion

Den of Daniel. They touched all the maya,nama, hutu and pygmy. They washed away almost all of the Herero's, Guatemala's, Amerindian and Aborigines.

Even written words are in the state laws, all over the world it is unwritten that people are desired to worship King Darius in different format. On violation, the human violators were thrown in the Lion's den of Daniel. It is not only the case of religious or ethnical atrocity but it is also the main frame of the economic atrocity of the rich over the poor in the nook and corner of the pins and dens of the entire landscape. 

ellular Jail is situated at Port Blair in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The jail was constructed by the Britishers between 1896 to 1900. It was a colonial prison also known as Kaala Paani jail, as it was surrounded by sea on all sides and there was no way the prisoners could escape.

It was used to exile political prisoners during India's struggle for Independence. Many notable freedom fighters like Veer Savarkar, Batukeshwar Dutt and many others were imprisoned here by the British government.

The Japanese took over it in 1942 during the Second World War and turned many Britishers as inmates. The Britishers used cruel methods of torture on Indian political prisoners. It used to be one of the biggest jails in Asia, and now it is a famous national monument.

The museum exhibits the prison life and hardships of the great Indian freedom fighters imprisoned here. The light and sound show can also be seen which show the historical events related to the place.

Cellular jail is one of the darkest chapters to date in the history of India during the reign of the Britishers. Whenever visiting this place, it's better to book Andaman tour package including airfare. This will help you in a hassle-free trip and discover Andaman at its best.

Here is a quick recap of the lesser known facts of the cellular jail.

The jail was constructed by the Britishers to torment and torture their prisoners, mostly Indian freedom fighters.

Each room of the prison measures 4.5 metres to 2.7 metres like a cell, thus earning the name 'Cellular Jail'. The building consisted of 7 wings and 3 storeys. It also has a central tower that was used by the guards to keep a close

was used as a prison. But as the number of prisoners increased the British built a jail to

watch on the prisoners.

Before the construction, the Andaman Island

retain their prisoners. The main aim of the prison was to restrict

the connection of the inmates with the outside world be it, family and friends. In order to avoid

communication among the prisoners, the cells were constructed in such a way that the door of each cell faced the back of other cell and all of them were in a row.

Several freedom fighters in the jail went through extreme pain that cannot be imagined. Some of them included Veer Savarkar, Batukeshwar Dutt, Sohan Singh, Vaman Rao Joshi, Nand Gopal and many others.

Two wings of the jail were demolished by the Japanese during the Second World War. After the end of the World War, in 1945, the Britishers resumed their control.

The food of the prisoners contained bread filled with worms and the water served full of insects. There were no toilets and light in the jail. The prisoners just received unbearable pain and physical torture. They were made to run oil mills. Kolhu and if they failed to abide, merciless wardens put them through great atrocities.

Diwan Singh, the director of health of India during its league for independence met the governor in lieu of seeking justice for the prisoners and the inhuman treatment. What did he get in return? He was arrested and tortured

Japanese hung him upside down, pulled flesh from his body, nails from the fingers and made him sit on a burning charcoal stove. He breathed his last on January 14, 1944.

The records of the prisoners are missing till date, and nobody knows what happened to them. The prisoners who

died in prison were thrown away into the sea. The museum and the memorial that stands today are a proof of the pride and valour of the prisoners who fought for the country's independence and never gave up. So, whenever you visit Andaman, make sure to book Andaman tour package including airfare. 

PRINTED MEDIA? OR ELECTRONIC MEDIA?

If you thought you were saving forests and protecting the environment by going paperless...think again.

hat's implied is that digital media is the environmentally preferable choice and that print media is the environmentally destructive choice. But is it possible that digital media could be more destructive to the environment and a greater threat to trees, bees, rivers and forests than paper-making or printing?

A heightened sense of awareness about the environment has developed in recent years. In particular, feelings of guilt and concern are on the rise about the use of paper and its alleged impact on the fate of our trees, forests and the environment. Are these feelings justified?

Paperless?

Public opinion polls show that concern about the environment rises and falls based on the state of the economy and other factors, but concern about the negative impacts associated with using paper and printing continues to rise. Nothing captures the essence of these feelings more vividly than the signature line appearing at the foot of more and more emails: "Please consider the environment before printing this email." At the ATM "Do not take printed receipt of transaction, save

This seemingly well-intentioned call to ac-

tion, as well as others like "Sign up for paperless billing, help the environment and save trees" confront consumers with a false dilemma and present a forced choice that may have unintended consequences. The false dilemma is: "By using paper to print your email or by receiving paper bills you are knowingly degrading the environment, destroying forests and/or killing trees." The forced choice is: "Eliminate your use

of paper or feel like a guilty hypocrite."

If you thought you were saving forests and protecting the environment by going paperless...think again.

The real dilemma you face is that you may be doing more to cause environmental degradation and deforestation by going paperless than you think, and making responsible choices requires informed decisions and rational tradeoffs.

Digital Deforestation

There is growing recognition that digital media technology uses significant amounts of energy from coal fired power plants which are making a significant contribution to global warming. Greenpeace estimates that by 2022 data centers will demand more electricity than is currently demanded.

What is less widely known is that mountain-

top-removal coal mining is also a major cause of deforestation, biodiversity loss, and the pollution of over miles of headwater streams.

If your goal is to save trees or do something good for the environment, the choice to go paperless may not be as green or simple as some would like you to think.

Digital media doesn't grow on trees, but increased use of digital media is having a profoundly negative impact on our forests and the health of our rivers.

How Green Is Digital Media?

Coal-powered digital media is destructive to the environment in many ways beyond deforestation. Coal fired power plants are responsible for 93% of the sulfur dioxide and 80% of the nitrogen oxide emissions generated by the electric utility industry. These emissions cause acid rain

Go Tell It On The Mountain and forest

It's somewhat ironic that print media and the paper-making industry are so often targeted for "killing" trees while digital media is so often characterized as the greener "environmentally friendly" alternative. While its record is by no means perfect, the forest products in-

dustry has made great strides in the adoption of sustainable forestry and environmental performance certification practices. In addition, the majority of the paper industry's power and electricity needs are derived from renewable biomass that is sourced from sustainably managed forests. On the other hand, digital information technology's dependence on coal-powered electricity that is derived from mountaintop removal goes largely unreported.


